PARTICIPATIVE TECHNIQUE TEMPLATE



Minimum number of participants: 2

Maximum number of participants:

30

Name of the technique: Theatre of Oppressed

Objective of the technique:

Make participants aware of the oppressive forces that act upon them, by deconstructing power structures

Specific context requirements:

- Enough physical space for theatrical production
- · No physical space between "actors" and "audience"
- · Existence of a neutral facilitator
- · Safe environment for sharing personal ideas and experiences

Instructions step by step:

A member of the audience shares a personal or closely related experience that has a negative impact in his/her life, or:

- The facilitator divides the groups into sub-groups and they list the daily conflicts they consider the most disruptive. They share the list in plenary
- Each sub-group selects a conflict and they prepare a narrative that reflects their selected conflict. The scene is presented in front of the audience, who can stop it whenever they want to include modifications

 The audience's suggestions should include potential solutions to the conflict, which are to be dramatised by actors

Required materials:

- Imagination
- Pens and paper
- Props related to the problem
- Music/sound system

Advantages:

- Increases solidarity and awareness
- Fosters empowerment
- · Creates empathy towards the oppressed
- · Encourages creative solutions

Disadvantages:

 Participants with no theatrical experience may be reluctant to enact their scene

When to use:

• Interpersonal conflict. Eg. harassment, gender bias in the classroom
